Walsh Wins with "Second Chance"

After delivering an inspiring speech titled "Second Chance," Carl Walsh won first place at the Toastmasters 2009 Region II Speech Contest in San Mateo, Calif. He secured his shot for the title of World Champion of Public Speaking at Toastmasters' International Convention held at the MGM Grand in Connecticut, Aug. 12 - 15, 2009.

Walsh, a founding member of Smart Toast, described how he seized a second chance to recover from "the worst marriage proposal ever," which took place on the top floor of the Empire State Building. He cites, "Nerves and fear of rejection caused me to bungle the words." Once on the ground floor, he started over again. With all the stress of the preparations gone, an honest, direct and heart-felt popping of the question finally attained a "Yes."

The international speech competition convened bringing the top 10 contestants from different parts of the world, all of whom advanced to the finals following a year-long process of elimination among 30,000 contestants. "Although the stakes are very high - because we're all there to win," says Walsh, "what's most impressive is the Toastmasters spirit of support and friendship throughout the organization."

While he didn't win the world championship, he remains one of the top ten Toastmasters speakers in the country. Walsh extended congratulations to Mark Hunter, a school principal from Brisbane, Australia, who emerged victorious.

When asked if he'd try again, Walsh replied with a resounding, "Yes!" clearly taking every opportunity to speak. "Contests are great because you travel much further in a short amount of time. It is the ultimate feedback and gives you a goal to shoot for." Apparently he will seize the day and take a second chance at the title next year.

Go for it Carl - Founder's District is behind you all the way.
