Ground Rules.

1. This committee was formed for the express purposes of preparing a reformation [split] proposal, sharing the information with the members and answering questions. Discussions will be focused on *how* we might split the District.
2. Of the five potential proposals, committee members would vote to determine the top proposal. Since many committee members expected to be absent during the meeting, they were encouraged to submit their vote via email prior to the conference call. Depending on the results, it might be necessary to hold a second round of voting between the top two contenders.
3. Decision is based on the statistics available in September 2015.
4. No one option is perfect. Each member should consider the potential for growth and leadership for each district. Suggested criteria to evaluate the options:
 - a) Keep dividing line simple and straightforward.
 - b) Both districts to have a proportionate number of members based on clubs (“Avg size” column in statistical spreadsheet).
5. Although the original email asked members to rank their top proposals and note “N/A” for those they didn’t want, during the conference call, the team modified the ranking process. We decided we should rank the top *three* proposals and apply the same point system used in speech contests: 1st place would receive 3 points, 2nd place – 2 points and 3rd place – 1 point. Absent members will need to revisit their ranking to include *three* options (less than *three* would invalidate the vote). Members of the expanded committee (see matrix below) have the right to vote by 11 pm Friday, 18 September. The completed matrix will be posted on the website as part of the minutes, in accordance with the Communication plan discussed in a later section.
6. All members agreed that once the option is selected, they would speak as one voice to support the winning proposal.
7. Implementation of the communication plan will begin once the proposal is selected.

4. What's next? Develop the proposal using Ball Road as the line and follow the Communication Plan.

Bob, I would greatly appreciate your help in pulling the updated information together for the revised proposal. We are planning to present it to the DELP on Wednesday (9/23). If we could get a draft by Monday, 9/21, that would be extremely helpful.

Communication Plan. This plan was presented to the team in draft form and updated to incorporate suggestions to improve Committee transparency and ensure District-wide dissemination.
